## Focus Verse

“Remember this day, in which ye came out from Egypt.” – Exodus 13:3



## Bible Story

Finally, the Israelites were out of Egypt. God wanted them to remember this day every year and carry this memory in their hearts, so He gave them a special rule: eat unleavened bread, which is like flatbread, to remind them of the quick packing they did when they were delivered from Egypt. God promised to bring them to a beautiful land, the land of Canaan, which is called a land flowing with milk and honey. When they got into this land, they were to eat unleavened bread for seven days, and on the seventh day have a feast to honor God. The Israelites were instructed to explain to their children of how powerfully God brought them out of Egypt. God wanted the Israelites to dedicate their firstborn sons and the firstborn males of their animals to Him.

As the Israelites went out of Egypt, God chose to lead them on a longer road out of concern they would return to Egypt if they were attacked. God led them with a pillar of cloud during the day and a pillar of fire during the night. As promised, God stayed with them during the entire journey, and the people followed His lead.
